Dear Mr. Frydnes and Members of the Nobel Peace Prize Committee,

As a Member of the United States Congress, I respectfully nominate Donald J. Trump, the 45th and 47th President of the United States of America, for the Nobel Peace Prize in recognition of his extraordinary record of diplomatic achievement and his continued leadership in advancing peace and stability across multiple regions of the world. No President or world leader has done more to advance peace and prosperity in the world than President Donald Trump.

On October 8, 2025, President Trump announced a historic peace deal between Israel and Hamas that will result in the release of all Israeli hostages from the horrific October 7, 2023 attacks, the return of Palestinian prisoners, and the partial military withdrawal of Israel from Gaza. While countless efforts by American and international leaders over decades have failed to achieve lasting progress, this agreement reflects the President's tireless commitment to restoring stability and safeguarding lives in one of the world's most volatile regions.

In addition to this monumental agreement, President Trump also brokered the Abraham Accords in his first term, another transformational Middle East peace agreement between Israel and multiple Arab countries. These historic accords normalized relations between Israel and several Arab nations—including the United Arab Emirates, Bahrain, Morocco, and Sudan—ushering in an unprecedented era of cooperation, commerce, and dialogue across a region long defined by conflict.

Over the last nine months of his second term, President Trump has successfully negotiated peace agreements in four different continents. These include agreements to end hostilities between Thailand and Cambodia, India and Pakistan, Armenia and Azerbaijan, Iran and Israel, and Rwanda and the Democratic Republic of Congo. Two of those countries, Pakistan and

Cambodia, have also formally requested that President Trump be awarded the Nobel Peace Prize for his leadership in bringing conflicts involving their countries to a peaceful resolution.

The Nobel Peace Prize was created to honor those who have done “the most or the best work for fraternity between nations.” Few leaders in modern history embody that spirit more fully than President Donald J. Trump. His diplomacy has saved lives, stabilized regions, and rekindled the belief that peace through strength and dialogue is still possible.

I therefore urge you to bestow upon President Trump the Nobel Peace Prize in recognition of his tireless pursuit of peace and his transformative impact on the world stage.
