To whom it may concern,

We, the Garrard County IDA, would appreciate your consideration in approving this request for appropriation from Andy Barrs office for the City of Lancaster. We are working closely with the Governor and Secretary of Transportation to move forward with the south 27 bypass through Garrard County and connecting to the completed south 27 in Lincoln County. As of January, all the funding has been placed in the Governor's budget for the project to be completed by 2029.

Over the last year, we have been working on identifying and purchasing property that could be offered up for future businesses locating in Garrard County. We have two sites; one eleven acres and the other property is fifty acres. We have joined forces with Rockcastle and Lincoln Counties to develop a Regional IDA board known as RGL. We have purchased property as a regional board for development sites.


Over the last three years, we have had two distilleries locate to Garrard County and a few local businesses are growing and expanding. We are feeling the pressure to upgrade and expand our sanitary sewer system for future growth in Garrard County.

Below is the summary of the project that Lancaster City is preparing for:

This project would expand the City's sanitary sewer system to relieve overloaded and old portions of the existing system while positioning the city to be ready for a new state bypass highway that is planned to come past town. The proposed bypass should catalyze substantial commercial and economic development if adequate utilities service is in the immediate area. Additional details below.

The City seeks to construct 1,551 LF of 8-inch interceptor sewer, 1,781 LF of 10-inch interceptor sewer, 1,601 LF of 12-inch interceptor sewer, 10,575 LF of 12-inch force main, and one (1) major wastewater pumping station. The project will eliminate two aging and overloaded lift stations (Buckeye Pump Station and Hill Court Pump Station) and will decrease flow in an overloaded gravity line by re-routing flow to the new lift station.

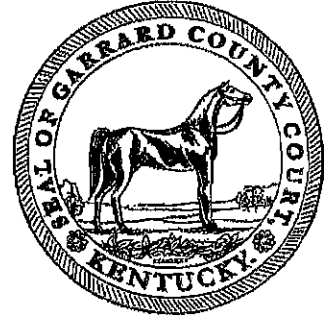
