A RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF A GRANT APPLICATION TO THE EPA STAG – CLEAN WATER STATE REVOLVING FUND FOR ROCKWELL ROAD SANITARY SEWER IMPROVEMENTS, TO BE MADE THROUGH THE OFFICE OF CONGRESSMAN ANDY BARR.

WHEREAS, Clark County will provide sanitary sewer to the Western portion of Clark County that is currently served with a failing package plant, and

WHEREAS, this project will provide Clark County with economic development opportunities, and

WHEREAS, this project would significantly improve the water quality and quality of life to citizens of Clark County,

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Clark County Fiscal Court:

Section 1. That Clark County Fiscal Court hereby endorses and expresses support for the County's application to the EPA STAG – Clean Water State Revolving Fund entitled Rockwell Road Sanitary Sewer Improvements for funding in the amount of five million (\$5,000,000) dollars for construction of sanitary sewer in which application is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.




Section 4. This Resolution shall become effective upon its enactment as required by law.
